
We have the honour to inform you that a meeting on Tariff Negotiations between Canada and Denmark has been held on May 5th, 1949.

According to the procedure fixed by the document GATT/TN. 1A/1, we herewith hand over to you two copies of the lists of offers that have been exchanged.




