
The Delegation of Pakistan and the Delegation of the United States of America hereby inform the Executive Secretary that they have today completed their bilateral negotiations.

NOTE:

1. The concessions listed below are subject to such modifications as may be necessary in the light of still pending negotiations of the United States. Items identified by an asterisk (\*) are under negotiation with another party or parties and, in accordance with the reservation contained in the headnote of the United States Consolidated Offer List, may be reconsidered in the light of the outcome of such other negotiations.

2. Reductions in duty will be made generally in two annual stages.<sup>1/</sup>

3. Descriptions of products, now given in statistical language, will be restated in legal United States tariff nomenclature in the consolidated United States schedule of concessions to be annexed to the 1961 Protocol of Supplementary Concessions.

<sup>1/</sup> Should the effectiveness of the concession be interrupted for any reason, the later stage or stages of reductions will not become effective until the rate which became ineffective has been restored and in effect for a total period of one year.

# INTERIM AGREEMENT

between

the United States of America and Pakistan

The Government of the United States of America and the Government of Pakistan, having carried on tariff negotiations pursuant to Article XXVIII bis of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade at the 1960-61 Tariff Conference of the Contracting Parties to the General Agreement, and desiring to enter immediately into a definitive agreement without awaiting the preparation of a Protocol embodying the results of that Conference, agree as follows:

## I

The provisions of each party's schedule annexed hereto shall be applied by it as if this Agreement were a Protocol of Supplementary Concessions to the General Agreement.

## II

The CONTRACTING PARTIES are requested to exercise the same functions with respect to the schedules annexed to this Agreement as they would exercise if these schedules were schedules to the General Agreement.

## III


This Agreement shall enter into force upon signature. However, the concessions set forth in the schedule of a party shall take effect, except as otherwise provided in such schedule, thirty days after the date on which that party has notified the other party of its intention to put such concessions into effect. A party which has put the concessions set forth in its schedule into effect shall have the right to suspend or withdraw them in whole or in part until such time as the other party gives such notification.

## IV

This Agreement shall terminate at such time as a Protocol to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade embodying the results of the 1960-61 Tariff Conference and incorporating the schedules annexed hereto enters into force.

GENERAL NOTES

1. The provisions of this Schedule are subject to the pertinent notes appearing at the end of Schedule XX (Geneva-1947) annexed to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, as authenticated at Geneva on October 30, 1947.

2. Subject to the provisions of this Schedule, to the provisions of this Agreement, and to the provisions of section 350(a)(4)(B) and (C) of the Tariff Act of 1930, the rates specified in the rate columns in this Schedule will become effective as follows:

(a) Rates in Column A will become initially effective on the day provided therefor in the proclamation by the President of the United States to carry out the provisions of this Agreement. Rates in Column B will become initially effective in each case upon the expiration of a full period of one year after the related rate in Column A became initially effective. A rate shall be considered as becoming initially effective as indicated above even though such rate reflects no change in rate of duty, and notwithstanding duty on the product or products concerned is temporarily suspended.

(b) For the purposes of subparagraph (a) above, the phrase "full period of one year" means a period or periods aggregating one year exclusive of the time, after a rate becomes initially effective, when, by reason of legislation of the United States or action thereunder, a higher rate of duty is being applied.
