CONTRIBUTIONS BY LESS-DEVELOPED COUNTRIES IN THE KENNEDY ROUND

Note by the United Kingdom Delegation

At its meeting on 18 March 1965 the Trade Negotiations Committee adopted a report (TN.64/41/Rev.1) by the sub-Committee on the Participation of the Less-Developed Countries which recommended, inter alia, that participants in the trade negotiations might make suggestions as to the offers which participating developing countries could make as a contribution towards the overall objectives of the trade negotiations.

2. The United Kingdom welcomes the participation of the less developed countries in the Kennedy Round and is glad to have this opportunity of making suggestions as to the contribution they might make.

3. A list is attached of items in both the tariff and non-tariff fields in various countries on which we consider that contributions would be particularly important. The United Kingdom delegation looks forward to discussing bilaterally with the delegations concerned how the effects of these measures could best be limited compatibly with the trade and development needs of those countries.
