Sir,

Upon the instructions of my authorities I have the honour to transmit herewith the following statement which constitutes the negotiating offer of Poland :

Poland, like other member-countries of the GATT, is interested in the development of trade on principles of full liberalization and non-discrimination. It is, therefore, Poland's desire to take an active part in the multilateral trade negotiations within the framework of the GATT in the hope that the results of these negotiations will contribute to checking the increasing protectionism which represents a serious threat to the development of international economic co-operation and to the liberalization of international trade.

Recognizing the need of making an appropriate contribution to the multilateral trade negotiations, Poland is prepared :

- to reduce the rates of duty in the Polish customs import tariff introduced on January 1, 1976, in accordance with the generally accepted formula providing for an average 30-40 per cent decrease of duties;
- to enter into bilateral negotiations with all interested member-countries on their requests submitted to Poland;
- to participate in negotiations on the conclusion of codes of conduct in the fields of measures covered by the multilateral negotiations as well as on appropriate commodity agreements.

At the same time Poland cannot agree with the theory of some

member-countries of the GATT which purports that the state monopoly of foreign trade constitutes an obstacle to trade. In the course of bilateral negotiations Poland is ready to present - in some detail - its position in this regard.

Poland wishes to stress her continued interest in maintaining the high rate of growth of trade - both in exports and imports with member countries of the GATT.

However, in the circumstances existing at present, when the rate of growth of Polish export is inadequate, due largely to the difficult economic situation prevailing in many member-countries as well as due to the introduction of numerous restrictions of discriminative character, the value of imports is determined by the payment capacity which, obviously, must reflect the need to preserve the balance of payments equilibrium.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to you, Dear Sir, the assurances of my highest consideration.



Initial Tariff Reduction Offer

Supplementing the initial tariff offer of Poland's contribution to the multilateral trade negotiations, made on the 26th of April, 1978 Poland submits herewith a detailed list of tariff concessions she is prepared to grant with respect to both agricultural and industrial products in her customs tariff.

This offer is made in accordance with the generally accepted harmonization formula with the coefficient 16 being applied. Therefore the formula used is $z = \frac{16 X}{16 + X}$ /where X is the base rate and z the resulting reduced tariff rate/.

Duty rates resulting from the formula are rounded to one decimal point. However, in order to simplify the application of customs duties, additional downward rounding may be utilized.

The base rates, from which reductions have been calculated, are those in force in Poland on the 1st January 1976.

Poland is prepared to implement the reductions in annual stages over a period of eight years.

In elaborating this offer Poland endeavoured to keep exceptions to a necessary minimum taking into consideration requirements of her economy as well as offers presented by other participating countries.

Poland reserves her right to withdraw or modify the present offer in the light of contributions of other countries and overall balance of advantages.


