



Sir,

The Delegations of Denmark and Indonesia met on the 11th December 1950 in exploratory talks in order to ascertain whether there existed a basis for negotiations between the two countries.

After an exchange of views and informations, it was felt that the present trade between the two countries does not provide a basis for mutually advantageous negotiations, and it was therefore agreed to terminate the exploratory talks.


The two Delegations confirm, however, that their Governments will grant each other Most-Favoured-Nation treatment in accordance with the provisions of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade.
