# Foreign trade in services – Brazilian overview

## Conditions that promoted the decision to built SISCOSEV:

- **Increasing deficits** on the services account of the Balance of Payments
- **Lack of detailed information** on foreign trade in services that impacts:
  - The implementation of effective public policies for the sector's development;
  - International negotiation in services;
  - Companies commercial intelligence.



# SISCOSERV

*INTEGRATED SYSTEM OF FOREIGN TRADE IN SERVICES AND INTANGIBLES*

**A coordinated policy of foreign trade in services that generates statistics for formulating and achieving other public policies for several service sectors**

**An initiative from the Brazilian government to strengthen the country's participation in international flows of trade in services**

# Cornerstones of Siscoserv

- The obligation to provide information in Siscoserv is established by Law.
- Joint management: Secretariat of Commerce and Services (Commercial point of view) / Secretariat of Federal Revenue (Taxes and fiscal point of view)
- Compliance with the GATS/WTO and the Brazilian tax law
- Statistics of foreign trade in services, including the four Modes of Supply
- Available on the internet – online processing

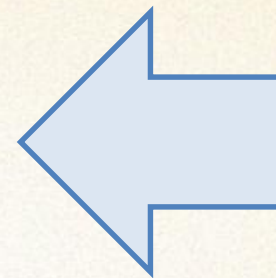
# Cornerstones of Siscoserv

- Access through Digital Certification and Electronic Power of Attorney
- Impossibility of using Siscoserv as an import licensing system.
- The registers of operations are only made after the beginning of the service provision.
- Commitment for promoting the interoperability with other systems
- Nomenclature: NBS (based on the CPC 2.0 from the United Nations)



Brazilian Nomenclature of Services and Intangibles

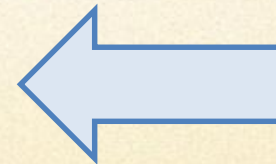
- 26 chapters
- Around 850 codes



Allows the precise identification of services as **products**

# NEBS

Explanatory notes for NBS



Subsidiary element to correctly interpret the NBS

# History of the implementation

- 2006 to 2010: system development;
- 2007: The system was included in the quadrennial planning of Brazil 2008-2011;
- 2011: The Law that requires the registering of transactions between Brazilians and foreigners (enterprises or individuals), involving the provision of services and intangibles, was established.
- 2011: The refinement of the system was included in the quadrennial planning of Brazil 2012-2015.
- 2012: Institution of NBS and deployment of sale module and acquisition module (modes of supply 1, 2 and 4);
- 2014: Deployment of the module of the foreign affiliates trade in services and intangibles, only outward (mode of supply 3).

# Gradual process of implementation of the system

Modes 1, 2 and 4 - beginning of the registers:

August 1st, 2012:	(3 chapters of NBS – construction and others services)
October 1st, 2012:	(5 more chapters of NBS)
December 1st, 2012:	(3 more chapters of NBS)
February 1st, 2013:	(2 more chapters of NBS)
April 1st, 2013:	(3 more chapters of NBS)
July 1st, 2013:	(4 more chapters of NBS)
October 1st, 2013:	(6 more chapters of NBS)
Totaling 26 chapters	

- Until December 2013 the registers could be included up to **seven** months after the start of the service provision.
- Since January 2014, the registers can be included up to **four** months after the start of the service provision.

# Gradual process of implementation of the system

## Mode 3 – Outward FATS

Beginning of the registers: January 1st, 2014

- For each Brazilian foreign affiliate only one registry is included each year.
- It is reported the Brazilian foreign affiliate total revenue in services of the previous year.
- The registers can be included until June 30th.

# Available Data by SISCOSEV

## Modes 1, 2 and 4

- Transactions between Brazilian residents or companies and non-residents or foreign companies.
- Brazilian and foreign services purchaser or seller data (name, address, country and tax identification number - TIN)
- Transaction data (value, currency, starting date of the service, date of conclusion, NBS code (the service that was traded), Modes of supply and country of destination of the service)

# Available Data by SISCOSEV

## Mode 3 (FATS Outward)

- Brazilian foreign affiliates data (name, address, country and tax identification number - TIN)
- Percentage of the Brazilian control,
- Period (annual basis),
- Total revenue and
- Main services traded.
