Mr. PHILLIPS' statement should read:

"Mr. PHILLIPS (United Kingdom) said that his Government had constantly urged the abolition of consular formalities which imposed barriers to trade out of all proportion to the convenience which they represented for the importing country. He particularly welcomed the abolition by the United States of all consular formalities. As a number of contracting parties had not yet been able to comply with the Recommendation, it had been suggested that there should be an examination of their difficulties in a working party. He was not convinced that the time of such a Working Party would be well spent; this would depend on whether the countries most directly concerned felt that such a Working Party would be useful and were prepared to take full part in the discussion. Otherwise the Recommendation was on record and his Government would rely on contracting parties making every effort to comply with it by the date mentioned."
