STATUS OF DECLARATIONS ON PROVISIONAL ACCESSION

Note by the Executive Secretary

The status of the six Declarations on provisional accession as of 9 March 1965 is as follows:

1. Provisional Accession of Argentina

The validity of the Declaration of 18 November 1960 was extended by the Second Procès-Verbal of 30 October 1964 until 31 December 1966.
